<b>Summary</b> THE VICTIM WAS BITTEN BY THE NEIGHBORS DOG THAT WAS RUNNING LOOSE FROM 245 NW 2ND ST.			
<b>Details/Narrative</b> <p>On 5-14-21 at approximately 1937 hours I was dispatched by the Madison County Sheriffs Office to 250 NW Elm Ave in Earlham reference a dog bite to a person.</p> <p>I spoke to the victim Michelle Thompson who lives at that address she stated that she was walking with her husband pass her neighbors at 245 NW 2nd Ave on the sidewalk when their dog came running at them and biting her in the back of her legs. Michelle did show me some marks on her legs that looked like a small dog bite. While I'm talking to her I noticed the same neighbor trying to catch the dog that had bitten her on the leg. They were having a hard time catching the dog chasing it around the yard. A few hours earlier I noticed the same dog running loose in the yard at the same residence.</p> <p>I then went over to the owner of the dog which was located at 245 NW 2nd Ave and spoke the her Dlorah Lee about the incident. While talking to her the dog attempted to bite me several times and finally they were able to get into their house. Dlorah stated that she had gotten the dog from a friend in Colfax and that the vet records were at that vet clinic. I gave her my business card with an fax number and my email address on it to have the vet send them to me within 12 hours. I advised her that her dog must be kept in the house until I get the vet records. I also told her that the dog has to be on a leash while outside and that she must obtain dog license from the city for each dog. I told Dlorah that if the Earlham Police Department does not receive the vet records that we may come get the dog at her expense and she will receive a ticket.</p>
