# UNAPPROVED MINUTES Earlham City Council Meeting October 14, 2019

The Earlham City Council met in regular session, on Monday, October 14, 2019, at Earlham City Hall. Mayor Jeff Lillie called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., and the following answered roll; Fredericksen, Griswold, Payne, Petersen. Absent: Swalla. Staff present: Clerk Hibbs, Police Chief Heimdal, Public Works Superintendent Coffman. Also present: engineer Scott Lee from Shive Hattery

# 1. Approval of Agenda

Motion by Fredericksen, second by Payne, to approve agenda.

Roll: Ayes - unanimous. Motion passes.

#### 2. Public Hearing

Proposed plans, specifications, form of contract, and estimated cost of the water tower project.

Motion by Payne, second by Griswold, to open public hearing.

Roll: Ayes – unanimous. Motion passes. Meeting opened at 7:01 p.m.

No one from public present to address issue. Scott Lee from Shive Hattery stated the low bid was \$1.37M for 200,000 gallon tower from McGuire Iron. The original engineers estimate was \$1.42M. Discussion on if there is a need for 250,000 gallons, at an extra \$85,000. Consensus of council was the 200,000 tower would be adequate for current use as well as future growth over the next 50 years, and, to go with the bid from McGuire Iron.

# 5. Boards, Commission, Committee Reports

a Public Safety Committee – Sycamore railroad crossing.

Meeting was held on September 8, 2019. Committee Chairperson Payne gave history of this issue, stating we could either install crossing arms at the crossing, at a cost of \$40,000 to the city, or close the crossing. If the Sycamore Street crossing is closed, the switch will be moved to the west of Chestnut Street. If this is done, the amount of time both crossings would be blocked would be cut by 75%. A public hearing will be held (see item 8f below). Letters will be sent to residents in the neighbor informing them of public hearing to address their concerns.

# 6. Department Reports

a. Public Works - Gary Coffman, Public Works Supervisor

Regular seasonal projects. Coffman described a service line leak resulting from digging for fiberoptic line. Pool is winterized. He is still looking for someone to do patch work on sidewalks and streets. Having trouble finding someone to do it. Asphalt company is coming. The leak locator is in town today. Attorney is sending a letter to McNairs regarding the pond leaking into the ditch.

b. Police Department - Chief Jason Heimdal

Chief reported he met with Christy Christenson who is the Madison County coordinator for CICS. CICS helps police departments who are called out on incidents with mentally challenged individual, and tries to provide options for these people rather than just being incarcerated. Also purchased tires for the Explorer, and had fire extinguishers in the squad cars tested.

#### 7. OLD BUSINESS

a Council shall review the bids for the construction of the proposed work and award the contract to the lowest responsive responsible bidder. Council will set time and date for entering into a contract for the work.

Motion by Griswold, seconded by Payne, to award the bid for the water tower project at 7:38 p.m. on 10-1-19 to McGuire Iron, and to sign the contract upon receipt.

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# 10. Clerk's Report

Resident at 820 Spruce Street wants to put up a privacy fence in a couple of feet inside of the rear property line. However, Earlham Code says this is a "Double Frontage Lot" requiring a front yard on both streets. Hence the fence ordinance for the rear of the house should be the same as a front yard. Jason from V&K doesn't believe that pertains to yard backing up to highway or major road. Homeowner will lose 30 feet of his back yard if he has to go by front yard setbacks. He feels council should make decision on this. Discussion followed. Put on agenda for next month. Clerk Hibbs stated she will contact Attorney Braland for his opinion, as well as check other city codes.

Hibbs said they are getting calls at city hall regarding Earlham's sesquicentennial. Mayor said he believed it is going to be in conjunction with Freedom Fest. Mindy Williamson is in charge.
